

Hoopla: Digital Movies, Music, TV, & Audioboks

Hoopla means to get excited about something and starting on April 1, for Hoboken Public Library resident card holders, along with other members of BCCLS libraries, Hoopla now means having online access to 15,808 videos (including movies and TV shows), 14,313 audiobooks, 212,595 music albums! Each month you have an access to up to 8 different choices.

You can borrow music for 7 days, videos for 3 days, and audiobooks for 21 days. Any time you feel like watching a comedy, drama, or sci-fi thriller you can go online and do so even when the library building is closed. Or maybe you'd prefer to listen to an audiobook or check out an episode of TV show including kid's favorites like Chuggington. Hoopla has a lot of great musical
