

## Get Artistic with the Hoboken Public Library

#### **Morning Drawing Programs**

Join us for a three part drawing class with art teacher Liz Cohen on Tuesdays December 6, 13, and 20 at 10 AM. On December 6, students will review the right brain drawing techniques, such as blind contour drawing to drawing the human eye, will be recapped and reinforced. On December 13, artists will continue to learn the proportions of the human figure. They will receive instruction on how to see and set up those proportions in order to start drawing people. Centuries old activities that have been practiced by art

students all over the world will be done to make students become more proficient at seeing and drawing people. Action figure drawing, timed poses and other exercises will help the artists relax and learn to draw accurately. On December 20, students, with their new skills, will practice drawing the human figure for longer poses of 15 to 20 minute duration. They will employ shading and volume to make the figures look realistic. Details like the face and clothing patterns will be introduced and added for further accuracy and reality in their drawings.

#### Introduction to Zentangle

## December Art Gallery: Birds and Bugs of NJ



The photographs in our December gallery were taken in New Jersey by Jean-Pierre Sefczek and represent some of the diverse and beautiful wildlife that is found in our state.

Born in Paris, Jean-Pierre became interested in photography at the age of 13, when he received his first 35mm camera from his grandfather who owned a Camera Store in the *Gare de l'Est* in Paris. Always interested in wildlife, he focused on insects initially. After earning a BS (Georgetown) and MS (Montclair State) in Biology

(emphasis on Insect Ecology), he began to photograph flowers and birds as well With retirement from teaching Biology for 25 years, came the time and opportunity to focus on photography of the wildlife in his own New Jersey backyard.
