Ona Gritz winner of the NJLA/NJASL Amy Job Partnership Award

Ona Gritz, the Young Adult Librarian at the Hoboken Public Library, has received the 2009 NJLA/NJASL Amy Job Partnership Award in recognition of the cooperative relationship she has cultivated between the Hoboken Public Library and the Hoboken High School Library. The Job Family has donated \$200 to the library in honor of the award. Ona was nominated by Michelle McGreivey, the Hoboken High School Librarian. Ona has hosted a series of poetry readings for the past several years in honor of Black History, Women's History, and Poetry month where local Middle and High School students read the poems of famous poets and their own works. A published poet herself, Ona has been inspirational in bringing poetry to life for the town's teens. She also this year organized a class to come for a viewing of the 2009 historic presidential inauguration. On a regularly coordinates class visits to the library for teens in Middle and High School so that they can become familiar with the library's resources and gain a better understanding of research techniques. She will officially receive the award on April 28th in Long Branch at the NJLA Honors and Awards Reception.
