Here's What's Happening in April @ Your Library

History Display

For the month of April the Library will be featuring a selection of works reflecting the history of Hoboken in display cases in vestibule on the second floor near the reference area. The books have been grouped by areas of interest including the arts, sports, transportation, schools, government, and religious institutions. Both primary and secondary sources are represented in the collection. The Holland Tunnel Scrapbook features articles from a variety of papers during the tunnel's construction. Hoboken's Lackawanna Terminal written by Theodore W. Scull describes the history of our historical station. Those interested in sports will find James M. DiClerico and Barry J. Pavelec's The Jersev Game intriguing with its history of

baseball and Hoboken's part in its origin. The 1902-1903 Council Minutes represent only one of many volumes available to give perspective on the town's past. Other books from the history collection may be viewed by request from the reference staff.

The event is free and begins at 6:30 pm at the Library.
