We are happy to tell you that we see a constantly increasing number of people using the library and signing up for a new library card. Did you know that while we are serving the needs of library patrons living in Hoboken we also extend the services to people who work in our town by issuing a "courtesy card?" All you need is proof of employment on company letterhead, in addition to the necessary IDs. Residents of other Hudson County towns are also welcome and will receive our library barcode allowing them to use our materials and library computers. Please check our website or call the circulation department at 201-420-2280 to get more information.

Have you heard of reciprocal borrowing? This means that once you have a Hoboken Public Library card you can also use this card at or reserve library materials from all 72 libraries of the Bergen County Cooperative Li-

brary Services consortium. Once we receive the materials you requested we will extend a courtesy call advising you of the title and the date of the material pick up. Many library patrons are using the system by reserving books either in the library or from their home computers. (Please note some restrictions apply to the courtesy card holders, please check with the circulation department).

We are committed to enhancing our collection and you will find many new books, bestsellers, travel books, videos, DVDs, and CDs if you come to the first floor of the library. Do not forget to check the mezzanine level where you find our non-fiction and Spanish books collections.

The Library is busy with many interesting programs. The summer reading clubs for children and teens are meeting on the third floor of the library and our reference department staff conducts regular weekly computer workshops. Please do not forget to check our monthly calendar on the back of this flyer.
