Gale Legal Forms Now Available online on the HPL Database Page

Gale Legal Forms provides a comprehensive look at various types of legal documents. Users can choose professionally drafted specialized documents in many legal subject areas including: bankruptcy, bill of sale, con-

tracts, divorce, employment, incorporate, LLC, landlord tenant, living wills, name change, power of attorney, real estate, taxes, and last will specific to NJ. Additionally, resources include the Law Digest, Definitions, and

Legal Q & A -- a collection of legal questions with answers from attorneys, arranged alphabetically and presented in laymen's terms. Hoboken Library Card Holders can access it from home with their card number.

Fine Arts and Music Database Available for Artists, Students, & Fans

The Fine Arts and Music Database along with other databases can now be accessed at http:// hoboken.bccls.org/html/ database.htm. With hundreds of full-text magazines and journals covered in databases such as the Wilson Art Index and RILM, this collection will provide resources to support research in areas such as drama, music, art history, and filmmaking. As with the Legal Form Database, Hoboken Public Library Card Holders can access these databases at home with library cards. Patrons can also access them at the library without a card.
