December Book Review: Cesar's Way: The Natural, Everyday Guide to Understanding and Correcting Common Dog Problems

Fans of the National Geographic Channel's The Dog Whisperer with Cesar Millan will be grateful for Cesar's Way, an accessible guide to help new and current dog owners better understand their beloved pets. Cesar explains that dogs are not complicated. They rely on three key elements in their lives:

exercise, discipline, and affection (in that order). "Problem dogs" can be attributed to "problem owners,". Cesar's Wav is really a training program for dog owners, with chapters devoted to understanding the "power of the pack," taking responsibility for "how we screw up our dogs," and

learning how to manage aggression. Cesar's book (a must-have for new and old dog owners) moves beyond basic obedience school techniques, and teaches owners how to change unwanted behavior by better understanding their "best friends."
