New Online Electronic Resources!

The Hoboken Public Library has two new online resources for Hoboken Library patrons to use from home or in the library.

America's Newspapers allows users to search current and archived coverage of events, people, government, sports and more with the largest collection of full-text U.S. newspapers. It includes the *Jersey Journal* from 1/16/1999 to current and is updated daily. Users can search by Headline, Author, Section. Caption and more.

The library also now has Grolier Online's La Nueva Enciclopedia Cumbre, a Spanish Language encyclopedia for native speakers and Spanish language students. It includes historical timelines, interactive maps, articles and more! A great resource for adults, and middle and high school students. Three other English Language Encyclopedia's are available from Grolier Online including Encyclopedia Americana, New Book of Popular Science, and Lands & People.
