New Computers

The Hoboken Public Library has installed six new Dell computers purchased with funds from the Computer Security Audit and Computer Replacement Grant through the Gates Staying Connected Program. The computers replace older models and will allow patrons to access materials more quickly. The computers have a full range of Microsoft Office programs including Microsoft Word and Internet Explorer. Floppy disc drives are available so patrons may save their work. There are a total of sixteen computers for public use in the reference department where



the public may access the Internet or work on documents such as resumes. For those unfamiliar with using computers, basic computer tutorials on topics like computer basics and Internet basics are offered by the reference librarians: to learn more about the tutorials see the calendar section.
