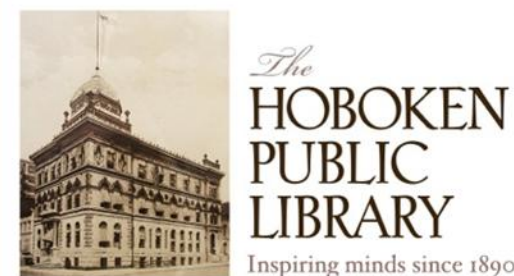

She displayed her work for the first time as part of the only LGBT art stop during the Jersey City Studio Artist Tour. In the past 12 years



she has gone on to exhibit her art in many solo and group exhibitions in NJ and NY. In 2004 Beth and her partner Cat Hecht became the first couple to become Domestic Partners in Jersey City and in 2014 were legally married. This past March Beth was one of 18 women honored by the county as part of their Women's History celebration for making a difference in the

community. As an artist, Beth presents works with images that are simplistic and often overlooked in order to invite us all to find common ground and feel interconnected through art.
