Teens Celebrate Women's History

The Young adult department will host two programs celebrating women this month.

On Wednesday, March 16th at 10:30a.m., students from Hoboken High School, Demarest Middle School and Elysian Charter School will gather together at our library to read poems by their favorite women poets.

On Thursday, March 31st at 5:30p.m., the Teen Advisory Board will present a movie party based on the theme of celebrating women with the title to be announced. Teens, if you want to participate in the planning for this event (and others!) join us for a Teen Advisory Board planning meeting on Thursday, March 3rd at 6p.m.. On Thursday, March 24th at 6:00pm The Adult Department will sponsor a Women's History Month concert featuring women musicians performing music by women composers. Hyunhee Lee on oboe, Michelle Bolton on horn, and Mary Wooten on cello will delight you with their music.

From the Hoboken Public Library Director

The Hoboken Public Library is pleased to announce their tribute to Historic Hoboken in honor of Hoboken's Sesquicentennial. As we celebrate Hoboken's 150th anniversary, we will bring you displays highlighting parts of Hoboken's incredible history.

During the month of March, the Library will host a display of antique postcards. These postcard views of Hoboken show many landmarks from the turn of the century through the 1930s. Come see the Hoboken Public Library, Church Square Park, City Hall, Demarest High School (before and after the addition of the top floor) and many other places of interest. Some are radically different while others haven't changed very much.

In April we'll host a display of books from our History Collection. Many of these books contain wonderful glimpses into Hoboken's past. Some of the titles we'll put on display include The Evening News and Hoboken, a turn-of-the-century volume published by the Evening News: Art Work of Hoboken (1893), a collection of early artistic scenes; Hoboken Portraits (1988), a collection of more recent photographs of people who live in Hoboken; Silver Connections (1999) which features a history of the PATH including drawings; and Block Prints of Hoboken (1932) featuring artwork by students from Demarest High School.

The library will host an evening event featuring the collection of transcripts of the Hoboken Oral History

Project available in the Hoboken History Collection of the Library – date to be announced.

In May we'll feature a display of historic Hoboken maps. You can see the city's original boundaries, as well as the original street plan.

We invite you to stop in and view these exhibits.
