The Hoboken Public Library celebrates Women's History with Don't Call Me Inspirational: a literary reading on Thursday, March 14th at 6:00pm. Artist, writer and disability activist Harilyn Rousso will read from her newly released memoir, Don't Call Me Inspirational: A Disabled Feminist Talks Back which Gloria Steinem called "...irresistible to read, honest, insightful and universal." Joining Harilyn will be poets Jennifer Barlett, and Ona Gritz. Jennifer is the editor of Beauty Is a Verb: The New Poetry of Disability, a 2012 ALA Notable Poetry Book called by Publisher's Weekly, "Usual and powerful". Ona is the author of the poetry book Left Standing, a columnist on disability and mothering for Literary Mama, and a contributor to Beauty is a Verb.
