Self Check Out

Located on the first floor. adjacent to the circulation desk, this new kiosk allows patrons to checkout books on their own. The onscreen instructions are easy-to-follow and allow patrons to checkout materials in 4 simple steps. Just scan a library card barcode, scan the books item ID (usually located on the inside cover above the pocket), place the book in the V-shaped well, and when you're done just press "print receipt". It's a great option when pressed for time or lines are just too long. Media and multi-part items should still be checked out at the front desk.

Online Homework Help

Thanks to a grant from The NJ State Library, in partnership with PSEG and Praxair Foundations, the library now offers Tutor.com which allows students to work with professional tutors through live chat. Students in kindergarten through 12th grade, as well as those taking introductory college courses, can receive homework help in English, math, science, and social studies from 2 to 10pm every day of the week. Adult Learners can receive help with GED Prep, Citizenship tests, Resume Reviews, and Job Searching. All you need is a valid HPL card. Spanish speaking tutors are available.
