Picturing America at the Hoboken Public Library

As part of the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH), We the People Program's Picturing America initiative, the Hoboken Public Library has received 40 prints of the nation's most significant historical artwork to put on display at the library. Bruce Cole, NEA Chairman, describes them as "a valuable resource that can help bring the past alive." The prints will be displayed in the second floor vestibule on a rotating basis. The library plans to host art appreciation for children and adults centered on the program in the upcoming months.
