

Puppetry at the Library

Our second librarian Nina Hatfield began the children's storytime programs at the library and often had a friend, who had written a book about puppetry perform at the library. On October 2 2 p.m., there will be a special puppetry program for children sponsored by the Friends of the Library. Free balloons will be handed out.

History of the Library and Nina Hatfield Monologue

On October 19th we will take a unique look at the library's early history through a monologue of Nina Hatfield performed by local hobokenite and talented actress, Florence Pape. We will then feature a discussion by Adam Winger, Digital Services Librarian at the Stevens Library and Matt Latham, Hoboken Public Library Reference Librarian on the Stevens Family and their

involvement in the library. The Stevens family donated the land and much of the money to build the current library building. There will be a display about the early history of the library in the second floor vestibule. At the end of this special presentation, join us for birthday cake.

Owls at the Library

Greeting patrons at the library entrance is a stone owl. We are having a special book mark contest for children and teens (grades K-12-winners will be selected in three age groups), who create a depiction of the library's Owl mascot on a bookmark template and/or suggest a name for our owl. New Technology and Computer Classes at the Library

Although the Hoboken Library is one of the oldest in the state, it is also on the cutting edge of technology. In September, six desktop computers were replaced with new models. Two lap tops will soon be available for loan to Hoboken Resident Card holders for in library use. We will also have two Sony Ereaders available to Hoboken patrons who can download the
