Children's Fall Programs begin in October.

Weekly programs are limited to Hoboken children with library cards. Rather than limited registration, story times are open to the first fifteen attendees on the day of the program.

Tiny Tots: Ages 6 months to 2 years 5 months. Tuesdays at 10:30 AM, Tuesdays at 11:30 AM, or Thursdays at 10:30 AM. (30 min) Join us for simple stories, songs, and finger games for moms, caregivers, and the children they love. Take home a coloring page. Children may attend only one session of these programs per week; this is our most popular program and we try to accommodate as many children as possible.

Big Kids: Ages 2 years 6 months to 4 years. Wednesday at 10:30 AM. Stories, songs, and crafts for older children, moms, and caregivers. A great way to socialize children.

After School Story

Time: Ages 3 ½ to 5 years. Thursdays at 3:15 PM. Stories, songs, and crafts for children who wish to continue story time after they have begun school. Stories will be longer and require a slightly longer attention span. Reading Dogs: Kindergarten and up who can read. The third Wednesday, of the month @ 3 PM. Call to reserve a "poochie appointment" with a trained therapy dog and practice reading out loud.
