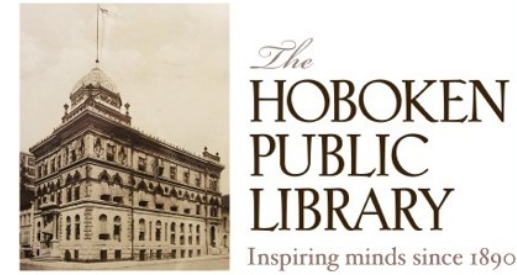

Celebrate LGBTQ Pride Month at the Hoboken Public Library

On Thursday June 15 at 7 PM, join us for Hidden Heroes of the Gay American Experience. For over two decades John Catania and Charles Ignacio have been at the forefront of LGBT media in the U.S., producing America’s first and longest-running gay and lesbian national television news-magazine program, *In the Life*. Among its hundreds of features over a two decade period, the *In the Life* series devoted numerous stories

to unsung mavericks of the past: figures like Billy Strayhorn, who was jazz great Duke Ellington’s right-hand man; musician and jazz band leader Billy Tipton, a female who lived forty years as a man in the male-dominated music industry; renegade Samuel Steward, a poet, novelist and professor who left the world of academia to become a celebrated tattoo artist and successful writer; and social movement leader Bayard

Rustin, who organized the 1963 Civil Rights March on Washington which featured Martin Luther King, Jr. These icons made profound contributions to the arts, history and culture.

Catania and Ignacio take you on an entertaining and provocative journey into the past and explain how these trailblazers’ efforts continue to reverberate to the present and beyond.
