Morningstar, Value Line, & Ancestry Now Available

Morningstar Investment Research Center and Value Line's Investment Survey Library Edition are now available online in the library or from home for Hoboken Library card holders. Ancestry is available on any of the library's computers. Go to: <http://hoboken.bccls.org/html/database.htm>.

Patrons have access to Morningstar's independent opinion on 1,700 stocks, 2,200 mutual funds, and 300 exchange rated funds. Morningstar Investment Research Center also offers accurate, up-to-date data on 35,000 stocks and funds, along with industry and market data. The database lets users build portfolio ideas online, and provides financial education through its Investing Classroom.

Value Line's Investment Survey Library Edition includes full-page reports with analyst commentaries as well as timeliness, safety, and technical ranks on the approximately 1,700 large cap companies. The Selection & Opinion features discussion of the U.S. economy and in-depth analysis of selected stocks.

Ancestry Library Edition has census, birth, marriage, death, military, and immigration records and more! You can research your ancestors or take a peak at historic maps and pictures.
