Native American Heritage Month at the Hoboken Public Library

In honor of Native American Heritage Month the Hoboken Public Library will feature in



our second floor vestibule gallery two prints of Na-

tive American inspired Art-work from our Picturing America Collection: George Catlin's *Catlin Painting the Portrait of Mah-to-toh-pah-Mandan 1861/1869* and two plates from the "Sans Arc Lakota" *Ledger Book, 1880-1881* by Black Hawk. There will also be a display of books about Native Americans, information about the first inhabitants along the Hudson river, and Native American artwork and artifacts loaned by local Hoboken residents.

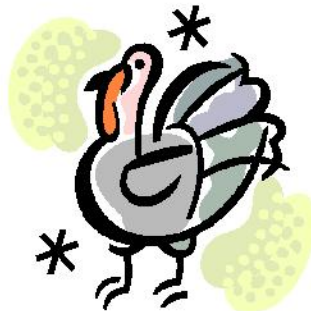
