We are always looking for ways to broaden our service to the community. So we are very pleased to announce that – in cooperations with the Hoboken Housing Authority – we have just opened a Learning Center next to HHA's Mama Johnson's Field.

The Learning Center is an extension of our longstanding partnership with the authority. This cooperation has produced "Library Corners" at three housing complexes where you can pick up free reading material.

Now at the Learning Center, you can borrow books, use Library Center laptops, take advantage of free Wi-Fi, and sign up for library cards.
