


The Hoboken Public Library, incorporated in 1890, is the third oldest library in New Jersey.



#### **Programs for Everyone**

The Hoboken Public Library has long been a community gathering place thanks to its vibrant and varied programs. Classes, concerts, discussions, outreach activities, and other events educate and entertain, making HPL a resource for everyone.

Children: From Story Times and a TOYBRARY providing a place for educational free play, the Children's Department's singular focus is to support and encourage new readers. The annual Summer Reading Program helps young students maintain their learning gains, while the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten campaign emphasizes early literacy.

For Teens: The Young Adult Department, and its Teen Zone in the Annex next to the Main Library, are popular, welcoming, and safe places for teens. In addition to its Hi-Tech Maker Space featuring a state of the art 3D printer, the zone provides an up-to-date collection of YA books, magazines, audiobooks and special programs tailored to teens.

For Adults: From classes, concerts and free-ranging discussions that tackle today's thorniest issues, to movie screenings and book discussion groups, the classes offered by the Adult department provide open forums for the exchange of ideas. We also offer one on one computer training. Our English as a Second Language (ESL) classes — sponsored by the Friends of the Library — help students from all over the world improve their vocabulary.

The Grand Street Branch, at 124 Grand Street, is a full-service Library located in Hoboken's Multi Service Center. With materials for every age, computers and free Wi-Fi, and Story Times and Play Groups for youngsters, this branch is a model of local community Library service.

The Learning Center at HHA, at 401 Harrison Street, serves younger patrons and their caregivers after school and on Saturday afternoons. Offering free Wi-Fi and the use of laptops, the Learning Center is an ideal place for homework and a bit of fun.
